·	This project was conceived in order to create a common European pattern on the integration of migrant people, by comparing the actions, methods and partnerships that each country currently adopts, and using the most effective elements for a democratic and world oriented Europe. These elements meet the general objectives of the program since they tend to develop a European identity and sense of belonging, overcoming cultural and linguistic diversity, and considering the differences as an enrichment. The active involvement of all stakeholders to the issues of immigration (PA, Migrants, Health and welfare services, Volunteers, Education and Training, Trade Unions, Employment Agencies) aims at promoting awareness of the possibility of change and the importance of the contribution of all the stakeholders, developing a sense of cohesion and social responsibility. The partners intend to give particular relevance to the participation of Volunteers (Associations, NGOs, etc), which in many countries deal with welcoming and supporting migrant people through an activity not yet appreciated as it should. The specific objectives of the focus areas are consistent with those outlined by the European Strategy 2020 in terms of inclusive growth, fair sharing of wealth, active participation to social life and focus on younger generations.
